## About the Video

## **Discussion Questions**

 The video begins with Munia, Ahlam, Rabia, and Naim listing the groups they belong to and explaining their identities. If you were asked this question, what would you say? How does your connection with these identities inform your life? experience/perspective? How does it seem to affect Munia, Ahlam, Rabia, and Naim?

- 2. Munia, Ahlam, Rabia, and Naim spoke about their work as changemakers, identities, challenges facing Arab society, and their hopes for the future. Did anything surprise you? What questions did it raise for you?
- 3. Pick of one of the voices you heard from in the video. If they were in the room with you right now, what question would you want to ask?
- 4. What do Munia, Ahlam, Rabia and Naim have in common? How were their experiences or views different?
- 5. This video was only a brief snapshot of Arab society in Israel. What perspectives and/or experiences do you wish you heard more about? What did you feel like was missing?
